He says that he is going to take a rest for a year or so and may do some traveling but that he and Mrs. Kelly will continue to make their home in Bar Harbor.

Linscott, who has been driving a delivery truck for the dairy, will continue the business along lines established in the past, making deliveries in Bar Harbor and up-island.

Die In Fire On Cranberry Island

William E. Sherman, 60, died attempting to save his daughter Betty, 14, from their flaming summer cottage on Great Cranberry Island Friday night.

Carmen Sanford, 13, daughter of Mrs. Belle Sanford of Bar Harbor, escaped with minor injuries but was hospitalized for shock. She escaped through a broken window of the cottage after trying vainly to get Betty to leave with her. As she fled down the road for help she heard Mr. Sherman calling to his daughter.

The Cranberry Island fire fighters arrived at the cottage

minutes after receiving the alarm to find that the flames had leveled it.

Mr. Sherman was born at Bar Harbor January 19, 1903, son of Frank and Helen (Jordan) Sherman.

He was president of the F.E. Sherman Company here; a member of St. Saviour's Episcopal Church, past member of Mt. Desert Island Lions Club, past chairman of the Bar Harbor Merchants Committee. He was a member of the class of 1925 at Bowdoin and a past trustee of the Mt. Desert Island Hospital.

Surviving, beside his widow, Mrs. Ruth Sherman, are four daughters, Mrs. Lawrence Had-
